



Traveling El Camino Real de los Tejas National Historic Trail Interactive Videoconference

The El Camino Real de los Tejas, formerly known as the King's Highway, spans 2,500 miles across several states and has served as the one of the main arteries of travel for soldiers, missionaries and settlers since the late 1600's. Throughout its existence, the road's development has been carved through economic, social, political and religious influences.

Classrooms chosen as participating sites may choose or may be assigned a city along or near El Camino Real to research and create a 10 minute presentation covering a brief history of the area and the historical influences that have impacted the development of the road.
